The top-tier Mallet 3 now sports a two-piece aluminum-polycarbonate platform, investment-cast steel wings, adjustable traction pins and both needle (inner) and cartridge (outer) bearings. The new pedal weighs in at 435 grams and is backed by a five-year warranty.

Ryders Eyewear turned to the likes of Jay Hoots and Shaums March when they designed the Shore. The collaboration paid off with a goggle that boasts mountain biking-specific air intakes, a shatterproof double lens that's less prone to fogging and a flexible, slim-profile frame that better fits full-face mountain-bike helmets. The Shore is also available with polarized lenses for an additional \$20.

SR SUNTOUR AXON ELD

An electric fork? Sort of. The Axon ELD bounces along on air springs—standard operating procedure for a high-end XC fork. When it's time to climb, however, simply push the handlebar-mounted lock-out button and an electric motor closes the damping circuit. The Axon ELD also features a hollow-forged aluminum crown, 32-millimeter stanchions, and is available in both standard quick release and 15-millimeter through-axle configurations.



TRUVATIV NOIR T40 RISER BAR

Truvativ's lightest riser bar to date now comes in a 700-millimeter width and weighs a scant 190 grams. The T40 is made from unidirectional carbon fiber and sports a "traction finish" in the stem-clamp area to help minimize slippage. The bar sports a nine-degree back-sweep and five-degree up-sweep and is available in both 15- and 30-millimeter-rise versions.
